**WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 08, 2023 AT 2.30 PM**

1. The Senate assembled at thirty minutes past Two O'clock.
2. The proceedings were opened with a Prayer said by the Speaker.
3. **QUORUM OF THE SENATE**

The Speaker, having counted the Honourable Senators present at the commencement of the Sitting and confirming that there was no Quorum, directed that the Bell be rung for ten minutes, pursuant to Standing Order 40;

And there being a Quorum after the expiry of ten minutes;

The Speaker invited the Clerk to call the Orders of the Day.

4. **HEARING AND DETERMINATION OF THE PROPOSED REMOVAL FROM OFFICE, BY IMPEACHMENT, OF HON. KAWIRA MWANGAZA, THE GOVERNOR OF MERU COUNTY**

The Senate resumed the hearing and determination of the proposed removal from office, by impeachment, of Hon. Kawira Mwangaza, the Governor of Meru County, as follows –

**Presentation of the case of the Governor**

Counsel for the Governor resumed the presentation of the case of the Governor, by leading the following witness in testifying before the Senate –

**Hon. Kawira Mwangaza**

**- Governor, Meru County**

The witness took oath and informed the Senate that: -

- i.) she had made efforts to unite the elected leaders in Meru County, whereby she had held a series of meetings with the Members of the County Assembly;
- ii.) there was a movement dubbed as “*Kibiri Movement*” formulated by a number of elected leaders, with a mantra of stirring trouble in Meru County, rendering it difficult for her to govern Meru County;
- iii.) there existed no audit or accounting report supporting any of the allegations of misappropriation of resources in the County Government of Meru;
- iv.) there exists an audit and accountability mechanism for funds withdrawn by way of imprest warrants, and no negative report had been adduced in evidence to support misappropriation of funds or breach of the Public Finance Management Act by the Governor;
- v.) there existed no evidence of withdrawal of funds from the county account by any of the alleged staff except for payment for legitimate per diems;
- vi.) the schedule of payments produced by one Mr. Salesio Mutuma misrepresented the IFMIS payments to give an impression of breach of procurement procedures;
- vii.) the personal charity project dubbed ‘*Okolea*’ is run through contributions by well-wishers in their personal capacity, and that no employee was invited or co-opted into project;
- viii.) the allegations on the recruitment of Mr. Edwin Mutuma Murangiri and designation of Mr. Nephath Kinyua as the Director of External Linkages were unsubstantiated for the reason that she is not responsible for recruitment in the County Government and had no role in designating staff;
- ix.) contrary to the allegation of exclusion of the Deputy Governor from official meetings, the Deputy Governor had abdicated his responsibilities towards the people of Meru by not attending Cabinet meetings;
- x.) two members of staff (Personal Assistant and Driver) alleged to have been suspended, dismissed and withdrawn by the Governor had resigned voluntarily;
- xi.) no complaint had been lodged by the Deputy Governor to the Governor raising concerns of any negative changes in his budgetary facilitation, which was done in accordance with the provisions of the Public Finance Management Act;

xii.) staff at the Office of the Governor were hired by the County Public Service Board, where the Board approved any request for appointment and the Governor played no role in these appointments; and

xiii.) she had never been convicted for contempt of court.

The witness was cross-examined by Counsel for the County Assembly and re-examined by Counsel for the Governor.

Thereupon, Senators sought clarifications on the testimony, following which the witness was discharged.

Counsel for the County Assembly, upon invitation by the Speaker, made closing submissions on behalf of the Assembly;

Thereafter, Counsel for the Governor made their closing submissions on behalf of the Governor, and further invited the Governor to make her closing submissions;

The Governor made closing submissions;

Thereupon, the Senate proceeded to an in camera session for ten minutes, pursuant to Rule 27 of the Rules of procedure for the hearing and determination of the proposed removal from office by impeachment of a Governor in Plenary.

5. **NOTICE OF MOTION - HEARING AND DETERMINATION OF THE PROPOSED REMOVAL FROM OFFICE, BY IMPEACHMENT, OF HON. KAWIRA MWANGAZA, THE GOVERNOR OF MERU COUNTY.**

(The Senate Majority Leader)

**THAT WHEREAS**, pursuant to Article 181 of the Constitution and Section 33 of the County Governments Act, on Wednesday, 25<sup>th</sup> October, 2023, the Meru County Assembly approved a Motion to remove from office, by impeachment, Honourable Kawira Mwangaza, the Governor of Meru County;

**WHEREAS**, by a letter Ref. M/CARES/VOL.IV/43, dated 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2023, and received in the Office of the Speaker of the Senate on Friday, 27<sup>th</sup> October, 2023, the Speaker of the Meru County Assembly informed the Speaker of the Senate of the approval of the Motion by the County Assembly and further forwarded to the Speaker of the Senate, documents in evidence of the proceedings of the Assembly;

**FURTHER WHEREAS**, pursuant to Article 181 of the Constitution, Section 33 of the County Governments Act and Standing Order 80 of the Senate, the Senate heard the County Assembly on the grounds for removal from office by impeachment of Honourable Kawira Mwangaza, the Governor of Meru County;

**AND FURTHER, WHEREAS** pursuant to Article 181 of the Constitution, Section 33 of the County Governments Act and Standing Order No. 80, the Senate also heard the Honourable Kawira Mwangaza on the grounds for her proposed removal from office by impeachment as the Governor of Meru County;

**NOW THEREFORE**, pursuant to Article 181 of the Constitution, Section 33 of the County Governments Act and Standing Order 80, the Senate resolves to remove from office by impeachment, the Honourable Kawira Mwangaza, the Governor of Meru County, on the following charges-

- Charge 1: Misappropriation and Misuse of County Resources
- Charge 2: Nepotism and related unethical practices
- Charge 3: Bullying, Vilification and Demeaning other Leaders
- Charge 4: Illegal Appointments and Usurpation of Statutory Powers
- Charge 5: Contempt of Court
- Charge 6: Illegally naming a public road after her Husband
- Charge 7: Contempt of the Assembly

6. **SUSPENSION OF SENATOR GLORIA ORWOBA, MP, FOR DISORDERLY CONDUCT PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF STANDING ORDER 121**

Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 121, the Speaker ordered Nominated Senator (Sen. Gloria Orwoba, MP) to withdraw from the precincts of Parliament for the remainder of the sitting day, for disorderly conduct.

Thereupon, the Senator withdrew from the Chamber.

7. **MOTION - HEARING AND DETERMINATION OF THE PROPOSED REMOVAL FROM OFFICE, BY IMPEACHMENT, OF HON. KAWIRA MWANGAZA, THE GOVERNOR OF MERU COUNTY.**

Order read;

Motion made and Question proposed;

**THAT WHEREAS**, pursuant to Article 181 of the Constitution and Section 33 of the County Governments Act, on Wednesday, 25<sup>th</sup> October, 2023, the Meru County Assembly approved a Motion to remove from office, by impeachment, Honourable Kawira Mwangaza, the Governor of Meru County;

**WHEREAS**, by a letter Ref. M/CARES/VOL.IV/43, dated 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2023, and received in the Office of the Speaker of the Senate on Friday, 27<sup>th</sup> October, 2023, the Speaker of the Meru County Assembly informed the Speaker of the Senate of the approval of the Motion by the County Assembly and further forwarded to the Speaker of the Senate, documents in evidence of the proceedings of the Assembly;

**FURTHER WHEREAS**, pursuant to Article 181 of the Constitution, Section 33 of the County Governments Act and Standing Order 80 of the Senate, the Senate heard the County Assembly on the grounds for removal from office by impeachment of Honourable Kawira Mwangaza, the Governor of Meru County;

**AND FURTHER, WHEREAS** pursuant to Article 181 of the Constitution, Section 33 of the County Governments Act and Standing Order No. 80, the Senate also heard the Honourable Kawira Mwangaza on the grounds for her proposed removal from office by impeachment as the Governor of Meru County;

**NOW THEREFORE**, pursuant to Article 181 of the Constitution, Section 33 of the County Governments Act and Standing Order 80, the Senate resolves to remove from office by impeachment, the Honourable Kawira Mwangaza, the Governor of Meru County, on the following charges-

- Charge 3: Bullying, Vilification and Demeaning other Leaders
- Charge 4: Illegal Appointments and Usurpation of Statutory Powers
- Charge 5: Contempt of Court
- Charge 6: Illegally naming a public road after her Husband
- Charge 7: Contempt of the Assembly
